

Become an AIB Certified Baker

You will learn the terminology of your chosen bakery product (bread and rolls, cake and sweet goods, tortillas, or cookies and crackers), the function of ingredients, the control of the processes, product formulation and equipment used, the methods of troubleshooting and problem prevention, quality control disciplines, leadership and communication skills, and financial management.

How does it work?

Step 1 — Choose one of the career path options listed below:

Step 2 — Complete the enrollment agreement and return it. (No payment is required with the application.)

Step 3 — Begin enrolling in courses. Although students can take courses in any order, students in the Career Path programs typically begin with the Science of Baking correspondence course. Students do not have to complete the correspondence course before attending seminars. However, our instructors recommend that students with little or no baking experience finish the correspondence course before coming to AIB for the Certified Baker seminars.

After enrolling in the correspondence course, students normally attend the seminars under their specific path option. Most students finish with the two core curriculum seminars on science and management. If students are likely to benefit from taking seminars in a particular order, the seminars are scheduled in sequence.

Step 4 — Students are allowed up to three years from the date of first enrollment to finish the entire program.
